



IN MEMORIAM: Frane Jakelić, prof. (1932. – 2017.)

Frane Jakelić, profesor pedagogije i psihologije, napustio nas je 29. 11. 2017. godine. Tihom je ispraćen 1. 12. 2017. godine u krugu obitelji.

Sin Marka i Tone, rođen je 3. 10. 1932. u Pakovu Selu gdje je odrastao i završio osnovnu te Učiteljsku školu. 1951. godine je maturirao i postao učitelj razredne nastave, a učiteljski posao predano je obavljao na području Dalmatinske zagore. Osim nastavničkog posla, i prije upisivanja studija, bio je predan i znanstvenom i stručnom radu te je iskazivao trajnu želju za napredovanjem u struci.

Diplomirao je na Studiju pedagogije na Filozofskom fakultetu u Zagrebu obradivši rad o mogućnostima ostvarivanja profesionalne orijentacije u osnovnoj školi. Radio je u osnovnoj školi kao pedagog i direktor te je nastavio pedagoški znanstveno i stručno djelovati. Postavio je temelje za razvoj profesionalne orijentacije za što je dobio mnoge nagrade i priznanja.

Angažiran je u nastavi pedagogije na Pedagoškoj akademiji u Splitu gdje je od 1973. do 1977. obnašao čelne dužnosti. Svojim je angažmanom značajno pridonio udruživanju Pedagoške akademije s Filozofskim fakultetom u Zadru i nastanku Nastavničkih studija u Splitu (1979.). Svoj nastavnički rad nastavio je na Fakultetu prirodoslovno-matematičkih znanosti i odgojnih područja u Splitu te kao vanjski suradnik na Visokoj učiteljskoj školi u Splitu i ostavio neizbrisiv trag u osposobljavanju budućih učitelja i pedagoga.

U izdavaštvu Udruženja za profesionalnu orijentaciju Hrvatske objavio je dvije knjige: „Profesionalna orijentacija i mogućnost njenog ostvarivanja u osnovnoj školi“ (1966.) te „Roditelji i izbor zanimanja njihove djece“ (1971.) dok je u izdavaštvu Školske knjige osamdesetih godina objavio dva izdanja knjige „Odgoj u obitelji i izbor zanimanja (1983. i 1985.). Napisao je veći broj znanstvenih i stručnih članaka, sudjelovao u uredništvima različitih zbornika pedagoške tematike, bio glavni urednik časopisa Školski vjesnik. Bio je požrtvovan učitelj, pedagog i otac. Pamtit ćemo ga ponosni na to što je bio dio našeg života.

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Frane Jakelić, professor of pedagogy and psychology, passed away on 29 November 2017. He was quietly laid to rest in the presence of his family on 1 December 2017.

He was born to parents Marko and Tona on 3 October 1932 in Pakovo Selo, where he grew up, completed his primary education, and studied to become a teacher. He graduated in 1951, becoming a primary school teacher, and he performed this job devotedly in the Dalmatinska zagora area. Apart from his teaching, and before continuing with his further studies, he was dedicated to scientific and professional work, and he exhibited an enduring aspiration to advance in his vocation.

He graduated from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Zagreb with a diploma in pedagogy, defending a theses on the possibilities of implementing professional orientation in primary schools. He worked at a primary school as an education specialist and principal, and he continued with scientific and professional activities in the field of pedagogy. He set the foundations of professional orientation, for which he received many awards and recognitions.

He was employed to teach pedagogy at the Pedagogical Academy in Split, which he headed from 1973 to 1977. His engagement contributed significantly to the joining of the Pedagogical Academy with the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Zadar, and the creation of Teacher Studies in Split (1979). He continued his teaching work at the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematics and Education in Split (1979) and as an external collaborator at the Teaching Academy in Split and left a permanent mark in the education of future teachers and pedagogists.

Two of his books were published by the Croatian Association for Professional Orientation: "Professional Orientation and the Possibility of its Implementation at Primary Schools" (1966) and "Parents and the Choice of Vocation of their Children" (1971), while two editions of his book "Education in the Family and the Choice of Vocation" (1983 and 1985) were published by Školska knjiga in the eighties. He wrote many scientific and expert papers, he was member of editorial boards of different collections of pedagogical papers and the editor-in-chief of the journal Školski vijesnik. He was a devoted teacher, pedagogist and father. We will remember him, proud that he was a part of our lives.

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
